1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled
3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4 This Act may be cited as the "Wildlife Crossings Pro
5 gram Reauthorization Act of 2025".
6 SEC. 2. WILDLIFE CROSSINGS PROGRAM.
7 (a) Authorization of Appropriations.—
8 (1) In general.—There is authorized to b
9 appropriated out of the Highway Trust Fund (other

than the Mass Transit Account) for the wildlife

2	United States Code, \$100,000,000 for each of fiscal
3	years 2027 through 2031.
4	(2) AVAILABILITY.—Notwithstanding any other
5	provision of law, amounts made available under
6	paragraph (1) shall be available until expended.
7	(b) WILDLIFE CROSSINGS PROGRAM.—
8	(1) In general.—Section 171 of title 23,
9	United States Code, is amended—
10	(A) in the section heading, by striking
11	" <b>pilot</b> ";
12	(B) by striking "pilot" each place it ap-
13	pears;
14	(C) by redesignating subsections (h) and
15	(i) as subsections (k) and (l), respectively; and
16	(D) by inserting after subsection (g) the
17	following:
18	"(h) Federal Share for Small, Rural, and Dis-
19	ADVANTAGED COMMUNITIES.—
20	"(1) In general.—Subject to paragraph (2),
21	in the case of a grant under the program provided
22	to an eligible entity for the benefit of a small, rural,
23	or disadvantaged community, the Federal share of
24	the cost of the project shall be 90 percent.

1	"(2) Waiver.—The Secretary may increase the
2	Federal share under paragraph (1) to 100 percent
3	if the Secretary determines that the eligible entity is
4	unable to pay, or would experience significant finan-
5	cial hardship if required to pay, the non-Federal
6	share.
7	"(i) Tribal Technical Assistance.—
8	"(1) In general.—The Secretary may use an
9	amount equal to not more than 0.5 percent of the
10	amounts made available to carry out the program
11	for each fiscal year to improve the ability of eligible
12	entities described in subsection (c)(6) to access fund-
13	ing for projects under the program in an efficient
14	and expeditious manner by providing to those enti-
15	ties application assistance, technical assistance, and
16	assistance in reducing the period of time between
17	the selection of the project and the obligation of
18	funds for the project.
19	"(2) Use of funds.—Amounts used under
20	paragraph (1) may be expended—
21	"(A) by the Secretary; or
22	"(B) through contracts with—
23	"(i) a Federal, Tribal, regional, or
24	State government entity;
25	"(ii) a private entity; or

1	"(iii) a nonprofit entity.
2	"(j) Grant Administration.—The Secretary may
3	retain not more than a total of 0.5 percent of the amounts
4	made available to carry out the program for each fiscal
5	year—
6	"(1) to review applications for grants under the
7	program;
8	"(2) to obligate and administer grant awards
9	selected under the program; and
10	"(3) to carry out the requirements of—
11	"(A) section 172; and
12	"(B) subsections (b)(6) and (i)(3) of sec-
13	tion 144.".
14	(2) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The analysis for
15	chapter 1 of title 23, United States Code, is amend-
16	ed by striking the item relating to section 171 and
17	inserting the following:
	"171. Wildlife crossings program.".
